A removable hat cover with a light flexible peak may be used if required.</p>	<p><i>IMPORTANT CHANGE FOR THE CROSS COUNTRY PHASE: Only a "Jockey Skull" of an even round or elliptical shape with a smooth or slightly abrasive surface, having no peak or peak type extensions may be worn for any XC phase. Noticeable protuberances above the eyes or to the front, not greater than 5mm, smooth and rounded in nature are permitted.
