

Conditions of Entry

1. It shall be deemed a condition of entry that the organisers, the landowner and his agents shall not be held responsible for any loss, injury or damage to competitors, onlookers, their property, servants, or horses and ponies howsoever caused on the premises.
2. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by the correct fee.
3. The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry without giving any reason whatsoever.
4. The organisers reserve the right to cancel any class or the event at their discretion. Entry fees will be refunded less a small administration fee.
5. No entry fee will be refunded unless a veterinary or medical certificate is produced not later than 4 days after the event.
6. The decision of the judges and stewards is final.
7. An objection to the result of any class may only be made by the owner, his author-ised agent or rider of a horse competing in the event. Any such person must make his objection in writing to the Secretary within one hour of that objection and pay a £10 deposit, returnable within 7 days if the objection is upheld.
8. The competition will be run under British Riding Club rules.
9. Horses and ponies must be 4 years old or over.
10. Correct riding attire must be worn by all competitors in line with Riding Club rules. In particular, everyone mounted, whether a competitor or not, must wear a hat complying with BSEN1384(1977) or PAS015(1998 or 2011) provided they are BSI kite marked or SEI and the harness must be properly adjusted and fastened. Failure to do so will incur elimination. Gloves are compulsory for dressage.
11. Competitors must behave in a good mannered way and, in particular, while warming up must at all times be aware of other competitors. Horses must pass left shoulder to left shoulder. Riders at the walk must keep off the outside track as this is used for faster work. If a horse is behaving badly then you the rider must take it out of the area and find a place away from other competitors to warm up.
12. In the interests of health and safety everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and obey the instructions
13. of the organiser and stewards.
14. There will be a First Aider in attendance. Medical facilities at the premises will be limited to standard NHS accident and emergency call out.
15. Class 5. Competitors may ride either test. To be judged on percentage.
